TO REGISTER:

Starting mid-January, we will post a link on our website to register for preschool school year classes. This will not guarantee you a spot - it will enter you into a drawing for available spots. From mid-January - February 7th we are accepting registrations for the drawing. On February 10th we will do a drawing and notify you if you have a spot in a class for your child. We are asking people to give us their options - as we always do - 1st choice, 2nd choice, 3rd choice, 4th choice but to not put down a class that does not work for you. Founded in 1974, the school at The Children's Farm, Inc. is a licensed half-day program for children ages three and four. It emphasizes fostering the child's intellectual, social, physical, and emotional growth, using the farm animals, garden and nature as the learning environment. Small classes with qualified teachers allow the consideration of each child's abilities and interests. Consistent classes through the school year promote friendships and growing social skills. Parent involvement is encouraged through parent visiting days, parent-teacher conferences and parent use of classroom observation windows. In addition, a parent orientation night, parent discussion meetings, and class picnics are offered.
